When do Leaving Cert results come out?

The Leaving Certificate 2024 results will come out on **Friday the 23rd of August 2024 at 10am**.

How do I view my Leaving Cert results?

Go to your school for 10am OR you will get your Leaving Cert results via the <u>Candidate Self Service Portal (CSSP</u>). If you are using the CSSP, have the following in front of you before 10am:

- the laptop or your phone you will use to Log In
- your examination number
- your PIN
- your PPSN

How do I calculate my Leaving Cert points?

To calculate your points, you will need

https://www.cao.ie/index.php?page=scoring&s=lcepointsgrid to assign the correct amount of points to each of your grades. Once you have done that, take the six highest results (by points value), and add them together to get your total CAO Points plus an extra 25 points for higher maths H6 & above.

What do I do if I think one of my Leaving Cert results is wrong?

The Leaving Cert is an exam set by humans, sat by humans, and corrected by humans, so of course there's more than the occasional mistake. So if you've **consistently been a H1 student** in Geography, felt your exam went well, and **suddenly there's a H3** on your results page, it's possible that there may have been an **error in correction**. The good news is that the CSSP not only allows you to view your results, but also to view your scripts. This gives you the opportunity to:

- apply to see exactly how your paper was corrected
- make an appeal if you think there has been a mistake

Viewing Your Script

You will be able to **apply to view your exam scripts** usually 4 or 5 days later. The viewing will either be **online or in-person depending on the subject**. Contact the school for further information.

LEAVING CERT. APPLIED

Students who successfully complete the programme are awarded a Leaving Certificate from the Department of Education. The certificate is awarded at three levels:

Level	Marks and Credits Required
Pass	60-69% (120-139 credits)
Merit	70-84% (140-169 credits)
Distinction	85-100% (170-200 credits)

Candidates who get less than 60% (120 credits) or who do not complete the course, are awarded a record of experience.
